ABOUT AUTISM

- Autism is a developmental disability that usually appears in the first three years of life. Autism is a "spectrum disorder" meaning that it looks different in different people.
- In general, people with autism typically have severe difficulties with communication, behavior, and social relationships.
- The incidence of autism has increased in recent years to an approximate occurrence of 1 in 59 births -- nearly twice as great as the 2004 rate of 1 in 125.
- There is no known cure for autism; however, autism is treatable. Children do not "outgrow" autism, but studies show that early diagnosis and intervention lead to significantly improved outcomes.





The Autism Awareness Ribbon — The puzzle pattern reflects the complexity of the autism spectrum. The different colors and shapes represent the diversity of the people and families living with the condition. The brightness of the ribbon signals hope — hope that through increased awareness of autism, and through early intervention and access to appropriate services/supports, people with autism will lead full lives able to interact with the world on their own terms.

ABOUT THE RIDE AND RUN

The year 2019 will mark the Autism Society's 11th Autism Bike Ride & Fun Run!
